

WHITEWATER LAKE ORDINANCE 7WR

(Established 1976 summarized)

DEFINITION: SLOW NO WAKE

Going at the slowest possible speed and able to maintain steering.

1) Slow No Wake Zones:

From shore up to 150 ft in a slow no wake zone

- a. Channels: are slow no wake
(there are a total of two on Whitewater Lake)
- b. State Park: north end of the lake is slow no wake

2) Slow No Wake Times:

No wake prior to 9:00 a.m. every morning

- a. After 7:00 p.m.:
on Friday, Saturday and Holiday evenings.

3) Disorderly Conduct:

Whoever, in a public or private place, engages in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonable loud or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which the conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.

4) Water Skiing:

Boats pulling water skiers shall travel in a counter clock-wise direction only.

- a. PFD'S (pers float devices): *Coast Guard approved life preservers must be worn by skiers, inner tuber or in aquaplanes or similar devices.*
- b. Maximum: *of two skiers can be towed at anyone time*

5) Swimming:

- a. If swimming from a boat, boat must be anchored and swimmers must remain 25 feet from the boat
- b. *There must always be at least one person who remains in the boat with a throwable preserver.*
- c. *If swimming more than 150 feet from the shore, swimmers must always be accompanied by a boat. The driver of the boat must have a throwable preserver aboard.*

Note: The Town of Whitewater Patrol Boat Officers also enforce all State Boating Laws.
